

STÉPHANE ROUSSEAU
BIOGRAPHY

Stéphane Rousseau is an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law, Université de Montréal, since 1998, where he also serves as deputy-director of the Centre for Business Law and International Trade.

He holds a doctorate in law (S.J.D.) from the University of Toronto and is a member of the Québec Bar.

Professor Rousseau teaches Corporation Law, Corporate Governance, Securities Regulation and Law and Economics. In 1999, he has lectured at the National Judges' College in Beijing, Peoples' Republic of China and at the Faculté de droit et science politique of l'Université de Lyon II – Lumière.

He recently co-authored a book entitled *Droit des sociétés par actions – principes fondamentaux* which deals with the fundamentals principles of Canadian corporate law. He is currently conducting two research projects funded by the Social Science and Research Humanities Council of Canada; one dealing with corporate governance, the other with the role of trade customs in international sales law.

Professor Rousseau has served as advisor to the Québec Securities Commission, the Association for the protection of investors of Québec, as well as various Montreal law firms.
